- iii. Participants must be registered students and faculty in participating universities. Each university must be represented by 4 students and 1 faculty member. The group of 4 students delegates should consist of;

Option 1

- 2 dancers or 2 actors; and
- 2 singers or 2 musicians







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Option 2

- 2 dancers or 2 actors: and
- 1 singer and 1 musician
- iv. The students' participants must have the ability to perform a traditional dance or music or theatrical performance and must be able to present issues and concerns on culture and the arts in his/ her country in the discussions. Student's participants are requested to prepare a cultural presentation for the Closing Ceremonies on October 7th. The presentation will be on a per country basis in 5 minutes. Thus, the universities coming from the same country must agree on the type and specifics of their country presentation so it will be coherent with each other, even if they come from different institutions. They will be given time to rehearse together in the hosted university.
- v. The accompanying faculty should be either the director or coordinator of the cultural affairs office or dean of the faculty of arts. Each country is requested to talk among themselves to nominate one faculty member to deliver a (not more than) 5 minute country report on the status of culture and arts and ASEAN awareness in the educational institutions in their respective countries. Each country will be represented by only one university. The speakers are expected to cover these points in their speech;
 - General description of their country's culture and arts landscape
 - The current status of their youth's awareness on their own country's culture
 - The current status of their youth's awareness on ASEAN and its implications
- vi. USM will organise the annual IMCC International Week on the same week in conjunction with the AYCF+3. The International week is a separate event focusing on ASEAN. The International Week will be participated by full-time USM International students. The 'Cultural Booth' is the only activity that will merge both AYCF+3 in the International Week. Other than that, both AYCF+3 and The IMCC International Week events will run separately. Note that, Full Time international students and IMCC Student Buddies will help and join together in decorating the booth.

For The IMCC International Week (Booth Exhibition/ Food Carnival) on the 4th day of AYCF+3 events, every participating country will be designated a booth to promote and introduce each country to the public. Every country can bring whatever attraction items that can be given or sold out at the booth such as pamphlets, traditional (packed/ dried) food, books, handy crafts, key chain, fridge magnets, tourism pamphlets, t-shirt, souvenirs, etc.

A booth's size per country is 15 x 10 feet and the layout is as below.

- vii. Kindly note that after the list of all delegates is received, AUN Secretariat will circulate it to every university's main contact person, head of student delegate and faculty member in the same country for further discussion.
- viii. The forum will be held on a cost-sharing basis. Organizers or host will cover operational costs during the programme which include hotel accommodations, local transportation and meals. Delegates are responsible for their own international travelling expenses and are requested to bear the **registration fee of USD100** (One hundred US Dollars) each which may be paid upon arrival registration. A receipt will be issued upon completion of the registration's fee payment.
- ix. The participants are requested to bring the following attire aside from the prescribed attire listed in this programme, for workshop and other related events;
 - Dancers: tight fitting black shirts and pants
 - Musicians/ Singers: black tops, black slacks
